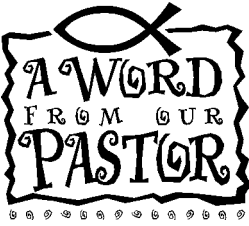

of lessons will lead you through a journey of how God guided and expanded His Church in those days.

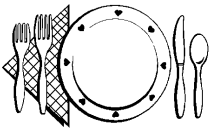

MEET 'N EAT:

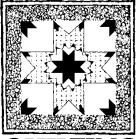
The ladies' Meet-n-Eat for April will be on **Friday, April 4th at noon in the church lounge.** Please join us and bring a favorite dish to share.

FROM THE BOARD OF COMMUNITY CARE:

NEW SCOTLAND EXTRA HELPINGS is made up of a group of people who buy one or more orders a month and covers our area. You can buy as many orders as you like or skip a month. PLEASE NOTE: this is not a handout – it is for everyone! With each order you purchase, \$.50 goes to run the small shopping group, provide paper to print advertising sheets, and stamps to get the word out to churches, towns and newspapers. Any extra money buys orders for local Food Pantries (2 or 3 orders a month). How does it work? You place your order early in the month and pick it up at a designated location at the end of the month. It costs \$14. an order for Extra Helpings Menu of food, and \$16. an order for the month's special (for March it was spiral cut smoked ham – average weight 7 to 8 lbs.) and you may place as many orders as you like. Forms and all the information about food, deadlines and pick up points will continue to be available on the table outside of our nursery. Check out the table at the beginning of each month so you won't miss the deadline for ordering.

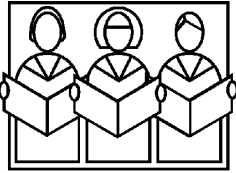

JUBILATE SINGERS PERFORM ON PALM SUNDAY:

The Jubilate Singers with a Festival Orchestra and professional soloists will present the “REQUIEM”, by Johannes

Brahms at Bethlehem Lutheran Church on Palm Sunday, **April 13 at 7:00 p.m.**

Unlike Requiems in the Roman Catholic tradition which are based on the liturgical Requiem Mass, the texts for Brahms' Requiem come from Luther's translation of the Scriptures, projecting a message of comfort and hope as we face life here and in eternity. Born, baptized and confirmed a Lutheran, Brahms conveys that message through texts that emphasize the "blessedness" of those that mourn, of those anticipating eternal life in the "dwelling places" Jesus has prepared, and of those who remain faithful as they die in the Lord. The texts of the first three movements offer hope to those who mourn. The fourth movement describes the joy of residing in heaven. The last three movements focus on the joy and comfort of the departed faithful.

Throughout the composition Brahms "paints" the text by selecting orchestral colors from the very dark beginning, using only the lower string sounds, to the triumphant brass announcement of the resurrection of believers on the Last Day. Special treatment is given to important words like "tears" and "weeping" on the one

hand, and "comfort" and "joy" on the other. Just as Christ used textual contrasts in the Beatitudes of His Sermon on the Mount, (Blessed are they that mourn for they shall be comforted . . .) to clarify His message of hope and comfort, Brahms used musical contrasts to accomplish the same purpose.

Seating is limited and tickets will be required. There will be a free will offering. We would appreciate a donation of \$15.00 per ticket.
